

<u>Practical Life Skills - Transferring water bowl to bowl using a spoon</u>: KG children learnt how to transfer water from bowl to bowl using a spoon this month. This was an activity that required immense patience and concentration and the children were keen to do it without spilling a drop of water.



<u>Sensorial</u>: Children of PG and KG spent the last month of the academic year revising their sensorial materials. Although they work with these materials throughout the year, in March they made a concentrated effort to re-work with these materials and the extensions again.







<u>Sensorial - Visual Matching</u>: Children of TG practiced visual matching using toys and materials that they find in their classroom. All the children were very keen to match the object to its outline and waited patiently for their turn.








<u>FMS - Pasting Stickers</u>: Children of TG enjoyed a Fine Motor Skills activity this month called pasting stickers. It requires tremendous patience and nimbleness of the fingers. Children tried their best to peel and paste the stickers and did not give up even when it was difficult.



Art - Making Invitation Cards: Children of TG, PG and KG made invitation cards this month for Annual Day. They used the process of Floating Chalk Art to make beautiful and colourful invitation cards. Children were struck by how wonderful the artwork looked when the chalk stuck to the wet paper. What was also amazing to see was how beautifully and spontaneously each child appreciated the other's chalk art too.











Art - Making Van Gogh's 'Starry Night': 'Starry Night' is a painting by Vincent Van Gogh of the night sky, inspired by the view from his window at the Saint-Paul-de-Mausole asylum in Saint-Rémy, in southern France. Van Gogh spent a year there in 1889–90 while suffering from a mental illness.

Our KG children (2024-25), drew inspiration from the 'Starry Night' by Van Gogh and created their version of it on 2 April 2025. They observed the painting and identified that the beautiful night sky painted by Van Gogh is made up of waves, swirls and circles. Armed with only two fabric colours - blue and white - children painted with paintbrushes and Q tips. Each child was excited to mix paints to create different shades of blue and enjoyed making beautiful dotted swirls and curves. Their beautiful artwork was done on aluminium foil - a unique base - because we wanted the children to enjoy a new sensorial experience, that of paint fluidly gliding on foil as compared to the way it normally feels on paper. Later, Apoorva Ma'am stuck all the artworks made by the children to make a beautiful night sky and made the beautiful cypress tree, moon and townscape using oil pastels on paper, with some yellow and white highlights using acrylic paints.















Farming: Children of PG and KG have enjoyed growing tomatoes in March. Every morning after alighting from the bus, they first rush to see if the green tomatoes are turning red. Their cheerful cries of wonder and excitement every time they spot a little red tomato are heartwarming.







Reading cards from parents: Children of TG, PG and KG received handmade cards from their parents this month. All of them were touched by the thoughtfulness of their parents and felt moved by all the beautiful things that their parents had written for them.



<u>Class Party</u>: Children of PG and KG enjoyed a lovely class party with delicious homemade food sent by all the parents. They were first excited to make the lemonade themselves and then try all the goodies. Children also relished the gulab jamuns and satisfied their sweet tooth.







Professional Development

Workshop with Circles of Safety: On 17 April, Eklavya Early Years educators attended a special workshop by Circles of Safety founder, Anuja Amin. In the workshop we learnt the not only about the first steps keeping our little ones safe from Child Sexual Abuse but also dealt with our own ignorance and discomfort with sexual education and abuse. This was a truly enlightening workshop and it led to all of us becoming more comfortable and confident about discussing topics around sexuality and gender, as well as questioning our preconceived ideas and notions about child sexual abuse.





<u>Fun PD with educators</u>: This month we had a Fun Professional Development session with our educators where we did a 'Positive Strokes' activity where each educator appreciated her colleagues. Later educators also tried their hand at learning Break Dance, which led to a lot of laughter. The session ended with positive feelings and was a fun way to rejuvenate.





Fun PD with Support Staff: This month, we organised two Fun Professional Development sessions with our driver bhaiyas and housekeeping didis. Each session was full of energy, laughter and happiness. With simple games such as quickly making a tower with paper cups, playing a carrom tournament, playing football, etc, we wanted to bring smiles to all our valued support staff. Both driver bhaiyas and housekeeping didis do invaluable work for Eklavya Early Years and their dedication and hardwork is very precious to all of us.





<u>Waldorf Workshop</u>: Two educators, Jayeeta ma'am and Anitha ma'am attended a Waldorf Workshop in April where they learnt not only about the Waldorf philosophy and pedagogy, but also the different handworks, songs and finger plays and art activities done by waldorf schools.
