










## Curriculum


**Practice Life Skills:** Combing - Kg children practiced combing this month. This is an important daily life skill that all children must learn and they were excited to do it. Practical life skill activities such as combing boost confidence and self esteem, and foster independence.




**Sensorial: Tactile Fabrics** - Kg children worked with Tactile fabrics this month. This sensorial activity enhances the touch sense. By closing their eyes while touching the fabric, children focused their attention only on the feel of the fabric and concentrated on the different textures.



**Sensorial: Sound Cylinders** - Kg children worked with the sound cylinders this month. This Montessori material enhances the auditory sense. Kg 3 children focused on matching the pairs of cylinders solely based on the sound. It is quite a difficult task and requires a very keen sense of listening to be able to differentiate between the cylinders.



**Circle Time:** Children of TG, PG and Kg learnt about fruits this month. They explored different fruits by touching, smelling, and observing them closely. This hands-on activity helped them learn about the names, textures, and smells of fruits in a simple and engaging way. They also discussed the colours and shapes of the fruits and shared which ones they liked the most. The activity encouraged curiosity, conversation, and sensory learning.





**Farming: Turmeric** - Children enjoyed learning about the turmeric growing in our school. They saw that it grows underground and were quite fascinated by its look as they have only seen it so far in powder form. Teachers peeled the turmeric in front of them, showing them the beautiful orange colour of the turmeric. Children also tried a tiny piece of raw turmeric. Their enthusiasm and willingness to taste is truly commendable as raw turmeric tastes slightly astringent and bitter. It made us very proud to see that all the children volunteered to taste it. Later, they saw the teacher cutting the turmeric into juliennes and then pickling it in a solution of lemon juice and salt. Two days later, children enjoyed the pickled turmeric with their lunch. Many took second helping and all were delighted by the sour taste of the pickled turmeric.




**Fine Motor Skills: Bowling** - TG children practiced bowling this month. This is a wonderful activity which strengthens their eye hand coordination, builds gross motor skills and encourages turn taking and patience.



**Fine Motor Skills: Sand pasting** - Kg children enjoyed a sand pasting activity. Applying Fevicol, and then carefully putting sand requires children to work meticulously and with the utmost concentration.



**Fine Motor Skills: Pulling Box** - TG children practiced pulling a box in a line this month. They learnt how to pull carefully without toppling the toys out of the box. This requires tremendous patience, restraint and skill.



**Movement class** - Kg 2 and 3 children had made sock puppets this month during their movement class. They presented their sock puppets to PG and Kg 1 during Assembly. They were very excited to showcase their socks and were happily answering questions from the audience about their puppet persona.
